

Having these "tools" and background knowledge was vital and so helpful for the interviews and projects with our clients. One of my favorite parts of the program was the Spanish lessons. I learned so much and feel so much more confident holding conversations in Spanish, as well as translating between English and Spanish. The connections and meaningful conversations we were able to have with people in Guatemala were so valuable. I am so grateful for the connections we were able to create and really enjoyed the work we were able to accomplish. This opportunity turned out to be an incredible experience, and really turned my summer around. I left this program with tangible skills on consulting work, so many new connections, and a better idea of the work I want to continue to pursue.

Virtual Social Entrepreneurship Corps introduced me to a whole new way of thinking about effective change making processes. I am so grateful to have had the opportunity to integrate empathy, critical thinking, and collaboration to design solutions alongside partners in Guatemala.

This program has brought 5 wonderful transformations in me. It made me: 1) more empathetic 2) a better problem-solver 3) emotionally intelligent 4) a strong team-player and 5) a better Spanish speaker. Despite the virtual setting, leadership did such a wonderful job of giving us the true Guatemalan experience. We were able to learn and simultaneously implement core consulting methodologies in a cross-cultural team setting. I made really strong connections in the process, not only with my team in the US, but also with our clients in Guatemala. Thank you!
